



Announcing The Boisen Institute of Clinical Pastoral Training: A New Division of the Spiritual Care Association

The Spiritual Care Association (SCA) is pleased to announce the creation of The Boisen Institute of Clinical Pastoral Training as a new SCA Division. The aim of The Boisen Institute is to create and offer the best psychodynamic chaplaincy clinical care and training for today's world.

SCA is establishing The Boisen Institute in response to outreach from numerous members of the College of Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy (CPSP). In these communications, CPSP members have inquired whether SCA might provide a framework in which they may pursue their education and professional lives as psychodynamically-trained chaplains. Rev. Dr. Pothin Ngyele approached SCA with a number of other CPSP chaplains inquiring about this possibility.

The Institute represents a natural progression of SCA's activity and commitment over the past two years to the field of psychodynamic chaplaincy. This has resulted in the foundational paper, <u>Psychodynamic Chaplaincy: Psychological and Spiritual Integration in Healthcare</u>, published in April of this year. We are currently in the process of developing curriculum to teach psychodynamic chaplaincy, and are offering monthly learning sessions through our <u>Psychodynamically-informed Chaplaincy Study Group</u>.

The Boisen Institute of Clinical Pastoral Training will substantially extend and deepen this work, and SCA is inviting all those interested to join the Institute at this time. The importance of integrity, relationship, competence, and caring will inform this endeavor. For those joining from CPSP, the chapter structure and all aspects of covenant life will remain the same.

While The Boisen Institute will embody academic excellence and clinical competence, it will never lose sight of the sacred calling that lies at the heart of chaplaincy. We are as committed to the life of the spirit as to the disciplines of mind and heart. Our foundation rests on Anton Boisen's conviction that *every person* is a living human document written by the hand of God—a truth that grounds us in prayer, compassion, and reverence for mystery.

The Institute's training will therefore unite rigorous psychodynamic insight with spiritual formation, covenantal community, and faith practice. In this way, we ensure that professional growth always flows from a living spirituality, not apart from it.

Other features of The Boisen Institute:

• Individuals who join this new SCA Division who are board certified through CPSP will receive board certification through SCA as well. The designation will be as follows:

BCC-BPC (Boisen Psychodynamic Chaplaincy).

- CPE units for the Institute which will determine and maintain its own CPE model will operate through SCA's higher education partner, Capstone University. Capstone will create a new School of Study for The Boisen Institute. These CPE units will be fully accredited; therefore, credits from Capstone's Boisen Institute CPE units will be transferrable and usable at other colleges and universities.
- Annual SCA membership normally \$95 per year will be offered at no charge for the first year to all who join the Institute.
- All prices related to renewal fees will be reduced by 50% from the previously established CPSP pricing. These include renewal of board certificate and diplomates.

The Boisen Institute welcomes individuals who are intent on staying faithful to covenant life, treating each other with respect and dignity, and addressing challenges and differences in a collegial manner.

We are also seeking those interested in active participation; our intention is to create a Division wherein everyone plays an active and dynamic role.

We believe the value that the Institute offers is substantial and lasting, including full accreditation for psychodynamically-focused CPE as well as SCA board certification, which is accepted by the majority of health care entities, and hopefully soon to include the Veterans Administration.

Once again, we feel it is important to stress that SCA is creating The Boisen Institute very much in response to communications from a large number of CPSP members. We have been made aware of challenges and developments that have taken place to bring new leadership at CPSP, and those reaching out to SCA have expressed a desire to move in a new direction. Through this new Institute and Division of SCA, we welcome these chaplains skilled in this important aspect of spiritual care.

Finally, SCA is pleased to announce that the Rev. Dr. Pothin Ngyele will serve as Director of The Boisen Institute of Clinical Pastoral Training. Leadership and advisory committees are now being established, with the core team consisting of Rev. Dr. Ngyele, Dr. Fredric Boyle, Dr. Thierry Hakpon, and Angela Davis.
